

Pastor's Pen

Easter was early this year, March 31st. The celebration of the Cross and Jesus' Resurrection

at "Easter" occurs each year based on the cycle of the moon. (Easter is observed on the Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox). So, Easter doesn't fall on a set date like Christmas which is December 25th each year. Regardless of the date we focus on the Cross and Jesus' suffering and death for our sins and His resurrection from the dead to give us new and eternal life.

What I would like to do in this Pastor's Pen is to look ahead to sermons I am going to share on April 14th, 21st and 28th. Because the United Women In Faith ladies group traditionally is in charge of the service the Sunday after Easter

(this year April 7th), I will then share 3 messages that continue to focus on the Resurrection. The first message on the 14th is entitled: "Easter is Over, Now *What?"* I will reflect on the fact that every day is "Easter" and we can remember and celebrate



the new life we have in Christ because Jesus rose from the dead. (Including our own resurrection one day and heaven itself.) On the 21st I will share a message that lays out in minute detail the evidence for the Resurrection. As Paul said in 1 Corinthians 15. "If Christ is not risen, then we are to be pitied", why? Because we are believing and proclaiming a lie. And thus everything about the Christian faith stands or falls on the Resurrection. On the last Sunday of April, I will focus on Thomas who insisted on "seeing" the nail marks on Jesus' body in order to believe. I will talk about Thomas' doubt in a light that does not make it overly "bad" but rather a steppingstone to the truth. Because Thomas, when he saw the evidence that Jesus had risen, responded: "My Lord and my God!" Doubt can become a good thing when we remain open to the truth as it is revealed to us.

So be ready to focus on the Resurrection of our Lord beyond Easter this year.



Spring is here! Praise God!

The elevator has been the topic

of the month. We have good news. The Trustee, Finance and Administrative Council committees have all done their jobs and we now are securing the funds to update the elevator with new electronic controls and hydraulic components to fully update the system to operate correctly. We were able to fund the entire project by using the church endowments to legally fund the project through an emergency use clause within the rules. The only topic under consideration not yet completed is the pay back portion. We are expecting the monies to be available this week to schedule the project with Mosley Elevator out of Plain City, Ohio by weeks end. Praise the Lord!

The Center Street entrance door issue is moving along. We have secured an estimate from Callahan Door, Lexington and another is expected in short order from Division 8 Glass LLC, Marion. Division 8 is still looking into the possibility of repairing the old lock mechanism.

Please continue praying for Trinity.

From Finance Committee

This is an effort to bring everyone up to date on recent events regarding the repair of the elevator. The following actions have taken place.



Trustees

Update

Trustees asked the Finance Committee to secure funds for the repair of the elevator. The repair was/is considered an emergency and should be started as soon as possible. After Trustees had received estimates for repair and chose which bid/estimate was most desirable. The contractor chosen for repair was Moseley Elevator with a bid of \$174,900.

Discussions on how to secure the funding took place and a resolution was passed by Finance Committee at their meeting on March 12, 2024, to <u>borrow</u> from our Endowment Funds to finance the repair. In accordance with the Finance Committee's Policy and Procedure Manual this procedure is outlined, and the steps were followed. There were no negative votes to oppose this action.

Following the guidelines the resolution needed to be presented to Administrative Council for final approval before any further action could be taken. The resolution was presented to the Administrative Council at their meeting on March 19, 2024. Discussion followed with questions answered with the information currently available. Resolution was and passed with no negative votes.

Plans to run a Building Loan (Elevator) repayment campaign are in the process and more detailed information will be forthcoming. Anyone wishing to get a head start may make donations to the Building Fund at any time.

The elevator is an essential part of the operation, the mission and the open-door policy for Trinity United Methodist Church. We will see the importance of the elevator when we experience the lack of it during repair/renovation which at this time is estimated to be 4 to 5 weeks with the start date yet to be determined.


